- From the Principal's Desk

As I sit at my desk and reflect on the term that was, I am so proud of all that we have accomplished. As a school we have worked together as teachers, students and parents and have enjoyed a highly successful Term 1 and set the platform for a great 2022.

The teaching staff at APS have been absolutely amazing under the current circumstances. We have been heavily impacted by COVID, students and staff included. As an example, yesterday we had 70, (today 99) students absent and 8 teachers not able to be present. Earlier in the week we had 25 children sent to the office sick or injured. These statistics have been reflected, almost weekly, throughout the Term, and yet we have managed to keep our school operational and teaching programs accessible. I would like to applaud our casual teaching staff who have been diligently committed to our school this term with their expertise and availability. As a result, we have minimised the impact on student learning. We have also been able to preserve our specialist programs, ensuring maximised learning opportunities for all students K-6. Families impacted by domestic violence, with at least one child under 12 years of age.

Families should:

- Live in the Sutherland Shire or St George areas or are able to commit to weekly attendance in Januali for the program.
- Have a stable home environment and capacity to fully participate in the program.

How can I be a part of the BRIC program?

Refarrals into the BRIC program are accepted from individuels and professionals.

If you would like to join the BRIC program or make a referral, please contact the BRIC team. Before commencing the program, the perticipant will be asked to attend an initial assessment session with a BRIC worker.

What is BRIC?

The Building Resilience in Children (BRIC) program is a child-focussed early intervention support service.

The program consists of a series of the repeut's parenting groups, one on one sessions, as well as sessions with parent and children together. We work with safe caregivers and their children over a period of up to eight (8) months to rebuild secure attachment between them as the basis of therapeatic change in order to reduce the impacts of trauma and build resilience.

Who is BRIC for?

BRIC is for safe caregives and their children, who have experienced domestic violence. Exposure to domestic violence can have a range of effects on children (and their caregivers). Every child is effected differently, and their symptome may continue even when the family is physically affect. Children who have lived with domestic violence may experience:

- Physical symptoms such as atomach aches, headaches, cating difficulties, sensory issues, bad wetting and frequent unexplained illness
- Falling behind at school
- Aggression, hyperactivity and controlling behaviours
- Behaviour that is fearful, fussy, sensitive, anxious and clingy
- Regular nightmares and sleeping difficulties
- Difficulties identifying and managing their emotions
- Challenges in their close relationships with caregivers, family or peers.

What do we do?

We halp caregivers to recognise how children are impacted by exposure to domestic violance and how it may effect their development. We assist parents to learn the still to create an emotionally safe environment and understand that children heal within secure and carriary fallotrachips. We work with families to appreciate the importance of rituals, routines and connecting together as a family.

The program draws from attachment theory, neurobiology research and trauma informed practice to underpin the early intervention and child focussed approach,

"Healed in Relationship"

The BRIC program is based on the understanding that healing from the impact of trauma occurs within a secure attachment relationship.

The program is designed to:

- Build and strengthen the protective relationship.
- Support caregivers to understand children's behaviours and underpinning emotions.
- Developing skills to support own and children's emotional regulation.
- Strengthening safe and therapeutic home environments.
- Support families to integrate playfulness, acceptance, curiosity and empathy into their relationship and routine.
- Increase caregivers' confidence in their role.
