Mobile Phone policy at APS

You may have heard in the media that from Term 4, 2023, NSW public secondary school students will be banned from using mobile phones at school.

What you may not be aware of is that mobile phones are already banned in primary schools. The ban on mobile phones applies during class, recess and lunch times.



Students are allowed to carry their phones while travelling to and from school.

The following rules apply to students who bring mobile phones to school:

- Students bringing mobile phones to school do so at their own risk - the school does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to mobile phones.
- Mobile phones are not permitted to be used or taken out inside the school gates.
- Phones are to be switched off at all times during the school day in student's bag.
- Parents must counsel their child on the inappropriate use of mobile phones.
- Mobile phones will be confiscated and stored in the school office until the end of the day if students are found to have used the device during school hours. The Principal or class teacher will contact the student's parents if this occurs.

Thank you for helping our students manage their mobile phones so that there is no disruption to learning. If you have any queries, please don't hesitate to contact the office.

Attendance Matters

Being at school is a very important part of any child's life. It enables them to learn, to make friends, to gain important knowledge and to develop a variety of skills which will prepare them for adult life. School and parents/carers are partners in making this a success. As parents/carers it is your legal responsibility to make sure that your child makes the most of this opportunity by attending regularly.

Repeated lateness is an unsettling start to the school day for both the child and school. Children will miss out on important learning opportunities at the start of the day.

Regular or prolonged absence, in any year group, results in limited progress and low levels of attainment. Children quickly begin to fall behind their peers and often never fully catch up with gaps in their skills and knowledge.

GUIDELINES AND OFFICIAL NOMINATION FORM

Introduction
Bayside Council is looking to celebrate the achievements of an outstanding sportsperson who has excelled in their chosen sport, either as an individual or part of a team, someone who has had a positive impact, or made an outstanding contribution, through their work for a sporting organisation or team.

The nominee must be an active, adult, official, administrator or club volunteer.

About the Award
The Sportsman of the Year award is an annual award by Bayside Council for outstanding sporting achievements in any sport or sub-group within that sport.

There is no age or ability restrictions. Nominations from all sports are welcome including veterans and of ability sporting teams.

Nominations are accepted if they conform to the following criteria: a) of local and community representation. The committee decision is final and its correspondence will be in kind only.

The winner will be presented at the Australia Day official ceremony by the Mayor of Bayside.

Criteria and Eligibility

- The nominee must be nominated by an individual or an organisation.
- The nominee must be an Australian Citizen and live within the Bayside Local Government Area.
- The nomination form must detail the achievements and background of the nominee, including the reasons for the nomination.

This may include:

- Outstanding achievement in the nominated sport/history as well as recent achievements
- Outstanding leadership skills and sportsmanship
- Outstanding ethical and community values
- Exceptional service to an organisation or a team

Please provide as much information as possible to assist the Committee to make their decision.

- A nomination form must be submitted to the Mayor of Bayside Council.
- The nomination must be supported by one or more referees who are not the nominator.
- The nominee must not have received this award previously.
- Only one nomination per person and the recipient will be named as the Bayside Sportsman of the Year.
- In exceptional circumstances the committee reserves the right to award more than one award if appropriate.
- The Committee's recommendations are adopted by Council at a final and its correspondence will be in kind only.
- The following people are not eligible to be nominated:
 - Current employees of Bayside Council, their spouses, de facto partners or relatives
 - Bayside Council staff, elected or State politicians, their spouses, de facto partners or relatives

About the Award
The Bayside Citizen of the Year awards are announced at the Australia Day official ceremony by the Mayor of Bayside.

The Award recognises the exceptional contributions made by an individual to the local community in an area that enhances the quality of life for residents of the Bayside Local Government Area (LGA).

All nominations are assessed in strict confidence by a selection panel which is comprised of council and community representatives.

Criteria and Eligibility

- The nominee must be nominated by an individual or organisation.
- The nominee must be an Australian Citizen and live within the Bayside Council LGA. Proof of Citizenship is required.
- Nominations for Young Citizen of the Year must be between the ages of 17 and 25 years as at the 29 January 2024.
- The nomination must detail the achievements and background of the nominee and state the reasons for the nomination.
- The nominee's contribution must focus on their achievements within the Bayside LGA. (However, their work or contributions outside the LGA will also be given consideration)
- The nominee should be held in high regard in the community or their field of work and by their peers.
- The nomination must be supported by at least one or more referees who are not the nominator. The Committee reserves the right in exceptional circumstances to award more than one award or no award if appropriate.
- The Committee will Award one person the honour of Citizen of the Year and one person Young Citizen of the Year. Residents will be known as the Bayside Citizen of the Year and the Bayside Young Citizen of the Year.
- The Committee reserves the right in exceptional circumstances to award more than one award or no award if appropriate.
- The Committee's recommendations are adopted by Council. If failed to correspondence will be in kind only.
- All nomination information and material submitted remains the property of Bayside Council.
- The following people are not eligible for nomination:
 - Current employees of Bayside Council, their spouses, de facto partners or relatives
 - Bayside Council staff, elected or State politicians, their spouses, de facto partners or relatives
