Bayside Council - Proposed changes to Avenal Street to improve pedestrian safety and vehicle flow.

Re: Avenal Street, Arncliffe Safety and Orientation Changes

Council has received concerns about school student and pedestrian safety in the region surrounding Amcliffe Public School, and are proposing changes to Avenal Street to impredestrian safety and vehicle street flow.

Current existing conditions of note are as follows

- 1. Sight line concerns at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Avenal
 - It is currently hard to for vehicles driving along Princes Highway to see pedestrians walking down the stairs of Avenal Street. This presents a significant safety concern, especially for school students.
- 2. Illegal vehicle movements from Marinea Street onto Avenal Street Avenal Street is a one-way street, eastbound. However, it has been observed that some drivers make an illegal turn at Marinea Street and travel westbound when they
- some unversimate an inegal run at waterness of the act of days we should write the spot parking spaces. This also presents a significant safety concern.

 Unsignalised crossing at the intersection of Avenal Street and Segenhoe Street A pedestrian survey has been undertaken for the crossing of Avenal Street and Segenhoe Street and have found that, during the school AM and PM peaks, 30 40 pedestrians cross the intersection in the east-west and 40-50 pedestrians cross the intersection in the north-south direction.

Bayside Council proposes three changes to the existing conditions:

- The reversal of Avenal Street from one-way, eastbound to one-way, westbound
 The clearance of vegetation at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Avenal Street to improve sight lines, and
 The installation of zebra crossings on the north and west legs of the intersection of
- The installation of zebra crossings on the north and west legs of the intersection of Avenal Street and Segenhoe Street.

These are diagrammatically shown in the figure below.

1. Reversal of Avenal Street from One-Way, Eastbound to One-Way, Westl

Noting that the sight lines from Princes Highway onto Avenal Street has limited opportunity for improvement, and the sight lines from Avenal Street onto Princes Highway can be improved, the reversal of direction should prove to be a significant safety improvement.

Additionally, this would ensure that drivers looking for angle parking can do so legally.

Drivers that currently use the intersection to turn into Avenal Street can turn at Tantallon Avenue, 125m downstream and should still be able to access all sites within the relevant area without significant delays.

2. Clearance of Vegetation at the Intersection of the Princes Highway and Avenal

Clearance of vegetation at the intersection of the Princes Highway and Avenal Street will allow drivers along Avenal Street to see pedestrians more clearly.

A crossing sight distance of 48m is recommended for drivers to see pedestrians in accordance with the Austroads Guide to Road Design (Part 4A). The extent of vegetation clearance will be determined in accordance with compliance with Austroads parameters.

At-grade zebra crossings with associated signage, floodlights and ancillary assets will be constructed at the north and west legs of the intersection of Avenal Street and Segenhoe Street to assist in school students' crossing. Students will be able to safely cross to walk either to a caretaker's car or to home.

Overall, Council believes that these changes will improve safety and flow within the area. However, we would like your opinion, as the proposal may affect you directly. 


