Men's Sheds are vital community investments delivering programs and activities that foster community spirit and contribute to building a more inclusive Australia. For many Australian men the local Men's Shed offers somewhere to go, something to do and mates that make it all worthwhile.

Since the first community shed for men opened its doors in 1993, the Men's Shed community has grown to encompass more than 2,500 Sheds in 12 countries.

Each year a small group of APS boys in Year 6 are selected to participate in a weekly workshop in Term 3 with the men at the Arncliffe Men's Shed.

The program was piloted by our Principal Pam Ladd who has always been committed and involved in taking the boys there each week. At first they are a bit shy, but it doesn't take long for them to come out of their shell and develop wonderful relationships with the men and learn great skills and craft at the same time. Road Safety

If your child rides a scooter/bike to and from school remind them safe riding habits near busy roads.

Stopping at every corner is a very good safety rule. Teach children the habit of getting off their scooter at corners and looking three times before crossing - right, left, and right again. Walking the scooter across the street rather than riding it is also a good habit, as it is slower and provides more control.

Wearing a helmet is one of the most important ways to ride safely. Let your child choose the helmet, put stickers on it, wear it inside, and wear one yourself; all these help children embrace wearing a helmet.
